
## Sphagnum tenellum



This pretty little sphagnum occurs in a range of unshaded moist or wet peaty habitats where the soil is very acid. In bogs it occupies a position intermediate between Sphagnum capillifolium on hummocks and S. cuspidatum in hollows, commonly growing with one or other of them and with S. papillosum and S. fallax. On heaths it is found on moist ground subject to occasional burning, often as an associate of S. compactum. In areas of high rainfall it also occurs on flushed heathy banks, on mountain crags, and in sheltered crevices among rocks. Altitudinal range: 0–1100 m.

It has declined significantly in the British lowlands, especially since 2000.

1200-1000Dioicous; capsules are frequent, ripening in summer, often in July, about three weeks earlier than those of other sphagnum species.

Suboceanic Boreo-temperate. W Europe from Spain to northern Norway, extending east through C Europe to western Russia. Eastern Asia, western and eastern N America, S Greenland, Mexico, Ecuador, Brazil.
