The Annotated lists of British Mosses & Hepatics can be used for marking desiderata.

Notes on preparation of material as N.C.R. vouchers, or for Distribution.

- 1. Use clean white paper (NOT newspaper) to make the packet. Avoid using gummed envelopes.
- 2. Packet size should not be less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" even if the species is minute: smaller packets tend to get lost in the folds of larger ones. When the species is very small it can be packeted within the larger packet.
- Species name, habitat and locality details, and collector's name should be clearly written on the outside flap of the packet. Place names, especially Gaelic and Welsh ones, should be printed. The value of the specimen and the record is increased by having full habitat details.
- 4. Voucher specimens are preserved in the BBS Herbarium and contributors should, if possible, send a specimen for this purpose.

The attention of new members is drawn to the "Directory of Bryological Research and Research Workers", obtainable from Botany Dept., The University, Birmingham, 15; price 6d. (It was prepared by Dr. S.W. Greeve, who is away in U.S.A.)
