Members are asked to help by sending all records they may have of these species to Dr. A.J.E. Smith, Dept. of Botany, U.C.N.W., Bangor, Caerns. before the end of October 1966.

Dr. S.W. Greene is out of th country until May. 1968. and therefore cannot act as referee for Orthotricum or Plagiothecium.

Dr. E. Lodge is willing to act as a referee for Drepanocladus.

Our memher, Mrs J. Seib, Hetfield College of Technology, Hatfield, Herts, is working on Experimental Taxonomy of Sphagna, and would be grateful for living material from the western parts of Britain with ecological data and map reference.

Our member Dr. R.E. Longton, of the Dept. of Botany, University of Birmingham, is studying the growth and reproductive behaviour of Polytrichum alpimum and P. alpestre and would welcome material from Great Britain or abroad. Details of locality and habitat should be given, where possible with a note of slope and aspect, while information on the presence or absence of male inflorescences and sporophytes in the locality, and their inclusion in the specimen where present, would be particularly useful.

ANNUAL BRYOPHYTE EXCHANGE.

The Annotated lists of British Mosses and Hepatics, or the census Catalogues can be used for marking desiderata.

Notes On The Preparation of material as N.C.R. vouchers, or for Distribution.

- 1). Use Clean white paper (NOT newspaper) to make the packet. Avoid using gummed envelopes.
- 2). Packet size should not be less that $3\frac{1}{2}$ " X 3" even if the species is minute; smaller packets tend to get lost in the folds of the larger ones. When the species is very small it can be packeted within the larger packet.
- 3). Species name, habitat and locality details, and collector's name should be clearly written on the outside flap of the packet. Place names, especially Gaelic and Welsh ones, should be printed. The value of the specimen and the record is increased by having full habitat details.
- 4). Voucher specimens are preserved in the B.B.S. Herbarium and contributors should, if possible, send a specimen for this purpose.
- 5). No plant should be gathered for exchange if by doing so its existence is endangered.
