AGM 2011

The AGM will be held at 4.00 p.m. on Saturday 10 September 2011 at Amgueddfa Cymru—National Museum of Wales, Cardiff. At the time of writing, the agenda will comprise the standard business, namely: Minutes of the 2010 AGM, Annual Report of the Trustees for 2010, Accounts and Treasurer's Report for 2010, Officers' reports, Report from Council, the election of Officers and Elected Members (see notice bellow), the place and date of the 2012 AGM, and any other business. The agenda, minutes and reports are enclosed with this issue.

Election of Officers and Elected Members of Council

Dr J.W. Bates, the current Vice-President, will become President on 1 January 2012 and it is necessary to elect a Vice-President who will take up office on that date and will become President on 1 January 2014.

The terms of the following Officers expire at the end of 2011: General Secretary, Editor of *Field Bryology* (the *Bulletin*), Conservation Officer, Librarian, Meetings Secretary, Membership Secretary, Recorder for Mosses, and Recording Secretary. The current holder of the post of Meetings Secretary has served for 10 years, the normal limit of tenure. All the present incumbents of the other offices are eligible for re-election.

J.K. Rowntree and J. Wilbraham will leave Council at the end of 2011 and are not eligible for re-election until a period of 3 years has elapsed; therefore two Elected Members need to be elected, each to serve for a period of 3 years.

Members are invited to submit nominations for Vice-President, Officers and Elected Members, sending them to the General Secretary of the BBS, Dr R.H. Carter, 6 Church View, Wootton, Northampton NN4 7LJ, to arrive no later than 10 August 2011. A nomination must not be made without the consent of the person whom it is wished to nominate. If elections are needed they will be held at the AGM in Cardiff on 10 September.

Summer 2011 Field Meeting

Week 1: 25 June-2 July 2011 Angus and Kincardine, Scotland; v.-c. 90 & 91

This area comprises much of Ursula Duncan's old stomping ground, which was last surveyed pre-1963. The centre for the week will be Brechin and the provisional programme includes a range of the Angus Glens, Glen Mark, Glen Lee, Glen Prosen, Glen Lethnot, Glen Dye, and the high ground of Mount Keen, Mount Battock and the upper reaches of the Water of Mark. For those who do not want to spend all the week in the hills there are

plenty of lowland sites around Brechan and Forfar, including the stretch of coast from Arbroath to north of St Cyrus, where the Old Red Sandstones and conglomerates abut lava deposits. In addition there are also some better known sites worthy of a visit such as The Burn and the North Esk and there are a number of old Angus records for *Dicranum spurium*, *Cynodontium jenneri* and *C. tenellum* amongst others and which it would be useful to re-locate.

Week 2: 2-9 July 2011
