Recorder for Liverworts, Sam Bosanquet, and Recorder for Mosses, Tom Blockeel, present their annual reports and new vice-county record lists

The liverwort year – 2014

total of 94 liverwort vouchers were confirmed during 2014, and one record was deleted. There were three duplicates - specimens sent in twice for the same vicecounty - so the true number of additions and amendments in 2014 was 92. This is a further slight drop compared with 2013 and a major decline in specimens since the Atlas revisions were at their peak in 2011 and 2012. Specimens came from 44 British and Irish vice-counties, 26 of which were represented by single vouchers. A recording weekend in North-east Galway H17 produced 12 additions and updates, whilst Rory Hodd's efforts over the year in South Kerry H1 resulted in 6. David Long updated 4 records and added a 5th in Peebleshire 78, Liz Kungu sent 4 vouchers from Wigtownshire 74, and the bryological revival in Glamorgan 41 also produced 4 vouchers, all of them new to the vicecounty. Eight vice-counties mustered 3 vouchers. Liz Kungu was the most prolific liverwort recorder of 2014, contributing 7 vouchers, with Rory Hodd and David Long coming close with 5 each. Their vouchers are among the 50 that have been stored in either the Edinburgh E or Dublin DBN herbaria: this is the first year that the majority of liverwort vouchers are at public herbaria other than BBSUK.

The liverwort year

2014 was not a particularly memorable year for liverwort recording, with a few notable exceptions. The majority of vouchers represented local or regional rarities rather than national ones, although of course these local rarities make just as much of a contribution to the national picture as the stars. 34 thallose vouchers compared with 60 leafy liverworts was a relatively high proportion, and included a good number of notable species

rather than being dominated by *Conocephalum* and *Marchantia*. The vouchers represented 60 taxa, which is a drop of 20 since 2013.

The recently published Atlas provides strong evidence that some of our liverwort species have spread significantly over recent years. The expanding epiphytes appear to be consolidating their ranges rather than continuing further north-east, and the three vouchers of Cololejeunea minutissima and two of Colura calyptrifolia (both from H17) filled in gaps rather than representing onward spread; no new vice-county records of Metzgeria consanguinea were made in 2014. In contrast, the non-native Lophocolea species are appearing ever more widely. Lophocolea bispinosa from Wigtownshire 74 is a big move south, albeit in a garden, as is the case in Argyll, and further records of that species were made from natural habitats in Glamorgan where it was newly discovered a couple of years ago. Lophocolea semiteres was also found in Glamorgan 41, new for the vice-county, well away from other known Welsh populations, whilst the Scottish and northern English populations get ever closer to merging thanks to a record from Dumfriesshire 72.

Hornworts clearly had a good year in 2014 in the Scottish Borders, and the mixed populations at Logan Botanic Garden in Wigtownshire 72 sound impressive. Winterbourne Botanic Garden in Edgebaston, provided Warwickshire's 38 first *Phaeoceros carolinianus* and, indeed, Warwickshire's first modern hornwort record. *Sphaerocarpos* also had a good year, and the three vice-county vouchers are the first I have received since starting as Recorder for Liverworts in 2009. The North Essex 19 population was noteworthy for supporting both *S. texanus* and *S. michelii*, whilst the South Devon 3 colony was mixed with the even rarer *Riccia crystallina*. Dawlish Warren has a good history of bryological recording and

this suggests that John Day's *R. crystallina* and *S. michelii* are relatively recent arrivals there, particularly given that they grow by the carpark.

Apparent declines in *Fossombronia foveolata* in south-east England, which contributed to its appearance on the UKBAP list, seem more likely to have been the result of changing recording patterns. The species was updated for both West Sussex **13** and East Sussex **14** during the year. Three new records of *F. incurva* in 2014 included Bill Chisholm's male only collection in North Essex **19**, which was confirmed by DNA barcoding at RBGE. Rotting logs in Cheshire **58** produced both *Riccardia palmata* and *R. latifrons* for Des Callaghan.

Charles Hipkin's voucher of Jubula hutchinsiae from Glamorgan 41 appeared after I pointed out that the photographed *Jubula* on the South Wales Bryophyte Blog represented a new county record. Richard Lansdown's updates of Trichocolea tomentella, Tritomaria exsectiformis and Lophozia excisa from West Gloucestershire 34 are but the tip of an iceberg as Richard continues to explore the Forest of Dean, which was last worked by H.H. Knight. Maurice Eakin showed that small vice-county Dublin H21 continues to support good liverwort habitat, with Bazzania trilobata and Lepidozia reptans at Howth. The deletion of Chiloscyphus polyanthos from Huntingdonshire 31 reflects the improbability of this usually saxicolous species occurring in a county where rocky streams are at a premium.

Plagiochila bifaria was updated for North Somerset 6 by Andrew Branson and Sharon Pilkington from impressively close to the species' north-eastern range edge. Updated Cephalozia macrostachya var. macrostachya from East Sussex 14 and Cheshire 58 were welcome, but Cephalozia returned to its typical unpopularity in 2014 after a bumper year in 2013. Two new Irish vice-counties were recorded for Cladopodiella

fluitans, and Jo Denyer updated Odontoschisma denudatum for North-east Galway H17. Nick Hodgetts' Cephaloziella spinigera from Skye, North Ebudes 104 and Des Callaghan's C. turneri from Merionethshire 48 were among the most beautiful finds of the year, as well as being some of the rarest in national terms.

Hygrobiella laxifolia, Anastrepta orcadensis and Anastrophyllum minutum were among David Long's finds in the border counties of Peebleshire 78 and Roxburghshire 80, and the BBS meeting in the latter gave Gordon Rothero finds of Eremonotus myriocarpos and Scapania cuspiduligera, two nationally scarce calcicoles. Two further vice-counties were vouched for A. minutum, whilst its rarer relative A. hellerianum was discovered new to Cardiganshire 46 by Des Callaghan. Anglesey 52 is a very lowland setting in which to find Lophozia sudetica, which is largely restricted to our western hills and mountains. Rory Hodd collected both Scapania aspera and Leiocolea bantriensis in West Cork H3, updating the latter for the Bantry area after which it was named. He also provided a suite of specimens of Marsupella emarginata var. aquatica from the far south-west. Last, but by no means least, was Anthony Gregory's discovery of Solenostoma caespiticium in South Lancashire **59**. This is perhaps the rarest of all the liverworts found in 2015, as well as being one of the smallest and most difficult to find.
