The International Association of Bryologists (IAB; <http://www.bryology.org>) is a society whose membership subscription is paid in US dollars. Members receive the *Bryological Times*, a quarterly newsletter edited by Geert Raeymaekers (Belgium) with timely reviews, news and notes on bryology. IAB also runs international meetings.

The annual membership fee is 11 US dollars, which is about 5.6 GB pounds, or to the nearest

round number £6. In several countries, there is a national collector of IAB dues, who then sends the money off to the USA. For many years Dr F. H. Dawson collected dues for IAB members in the UK. Now he has stepped down as collector and I am sending out this note in the hope of finding a new one.
